28-June		The Giampoli family arrives Entebee, Uganda to relax & tour Kampala. We then head to Bwindi Impenetrable National Park for a gorilla trek as practice for the upcoming gorilla treks.

		You will be met at the airport and transferred to the Kigali Serena Hotel
3-July		After breakfast, we'll begin our drive to Volcans National Park. On the way we will stop and visit the Kigali Memorial Center. For those of you too young to remember, over the course of 100 days in 1994, over 800,000 Rwandans were killed. The murders occurred because of tension between the African ethnic groups, the Tutsis and the Hutus. Most of the people killed were Tutsis and it was a group of rebels led by the Tutsis that stopped the killings. Checkout the movie Hotel Rwanda.
4-July		Early afternoon, we check in to <u>Sabyinyo Silverback Lodge</u> After an early breakfast, we will take a 15 minute drive to the National Park headquarters
4-July		where we will be assigned a gorilla family to visit. The treks take place on the slopes of the Virunga Volcanoes and you should be in good physical condition as some of the trek can be physically demanding. The treks normally start in the cultivated land on the base of the volcanoes and then you are guided up into the beautiful dense misty forests. The trek normally lasts between 2 and 5 hours depending on the location of the gorilla family. A maximum of eight visitors is allowed per gorilla family. Once we reach the gorillas we are permitted to stay for one hour to view them.
		After viewing, we'll trek back to the park headquarters and return to our lodge for cocktails and dinner. There probably won't be any fireworks, but I'm sure we will all get a good night's sleep
		Note: This will be as good as gorilla trekking at Disney's Animal Kingdommaybe even better!
5-July		We will all visit a different gorilla family
6-July	18:10 22:00	This morning you can hike around the property, go birding, or just lounge around the lodge. After lunch, we'll head back to Kigali for our evening flight to Johannesburg Depart Kigali on South African Airways #7167 Arrive Johannesburg
		After retrieving our luggage, we'll walk to the <u>Intercontinental O.R. Tambo Airport</u> where we spend the night.
7-July		Early this morning after breakfast, we'll walk back to the airport for our charter flight to Sabi Sands for four nights at Singita Ebony Lodge. Upon arrival, we will enjoy lunch and then head off on our first game drive.

Accommodation: Kigali Serena Hotel
