cuisine, like vibrant rigatoni all'amatriciana or creamy arancini with meat sauce, made with palpably fresh, local produce. 1.7 km (near Vittorio Emanuele & Termi) <u>Agate Romeo</u> *Closed Saturday and Sunday. Via Carlo Alberto 45* Husband-andwife team Agata Parisella and Romeo Caraccio fuse contemporary cuisine with venerable Roman traditions. Dishes include simple yet delicious spaghetti with grated Pecorino cheese and black pepper, the fish of the day in a light tomato sauce with fresh vegetables, and thinly sliced veal with sautéed porcini mushrooms.

1.6km Expensive II Convivio, Vicolo dei Soldati, 31

1.7km (near Vittorio Emanuele) Trattoria Monti, Via di San Vito, 13/A Closed Sunday evening and all day Monday This family-run trattoria offers delicious regional food and outstanding service. Reservations are essential.

1.4km <u>La Campana</u>, Vicolo della Campana, 18, Finding a restaurant in Rome on Sunday night can be a challenge, which is how I discovered this delightful spot. Reputed to be the oldest trattoria in the city, it might not be the most elegant, but the food makes it a must. The service can be perfunctory

1.4km (near Pantheon) <u>Clemente Alla Maddalena</u> Piazza della Maddalena, 4 Set on the charming piazza in front of the rococo façade of the Santa Maria Maddalena church, this lovely small restaurant offers many pleasures. Foremost is the cooking of chef Rita Colaiacomo, who draws on the traditions of Rome, Emilia-Romagna and Puglia, the land of her grandmother. Look for satisfying starters such as a cake of salt cod and potatoes with chickpea cream; pastas like the classic Roman homemade maccheroncini with tomato, bacon and sheep cheese; and main courses such as lamb chops with potatoes and rosemary.

2.3km (near Campo de' Fiori market) <u>Roscioli</u>, Via dei Giubbonari, 21/22 Restaurant, Delicatessen, Wine Bar The snug space is tucked away behind a gourmet grocery shop. Start with *burrata*, the creamy mozzarella-like cheese from Puglia, with anchovies; or squid-and-vegetable salad; then try the best spaghetti carbonara in town.

Since there are only eight tables at this popular little osteria, book before you travel to Venice. Choose the second service at dinner for more relaxed dining, and expect dishes such as grilled razor shell clams, spaghetti alle vongole and John Dory with sautéed mushrooms.

Osteria Anice Stellato Minchelli CLOSED SUNDAY & MONDAY

By shrewdly modernizing classic Venetian dishes and adding a few favorites from other Italian regions to the menu, the kitchen here has turned a simple dining room into one of the most popular restaurants in the off-the-beaten track Cannaregio quarter. Try the risotto with shellfish, and the superb fritto misto of shrimp, fish and vegetables.

At this delightful family-run restaurant, renowned chef Mara Martin serves innovative seafood dishes such as steamed sea bass with stewed apples and aged balsamic vinegar, and turbot baked in a potato crust. Begin with the celebrated pumpkin gnocchi with sage, Parmesan and white truffles. Reservations are a must.

Ristorante Quadri Michelin Starred

Given its location on the tourist-infested Piazza San Marco, this excellent contemporary Italian restaurant is a welcome surprise. The two elegant dining rooms, lit with Murano chandeliers, overlook the great square. It is a deliciously romantic experience to dine here on dishes such as seafood ravioli with baby clams, risotto topped with caviar, and steamed lobster on crushed potatoes with fresh herbs. Gracious service and an outstanding wine list.

YES 1.3Km 4*Trattoria Antiche Carampane CLOSED SUNDAY & MONDAY Sestiere San Polo, 1911

Tucked away (hard to find) in the back streets of the San Polo district, this superb seafood restaurant is a favorite of Venetians and in-the-know visitors alike. Start with the succulent baby clams cooked in white wine and olive oil and sprinkled with freshly grated Parmesan, and don't miss the tagliolini with *granseola* (spider crab), a house speciality. It also serves an outstanding *fritto misto* of prawns, squid and vegetables, and a hearty dish of cuttlefish cooked in its own ink and served with white polenta. The wine list is excellent.

To get to our restaurant easily, we recommend the **Line 1** vaporetto boat which goes along the famous Grand Canal: it will bring you from the bus or train station directly to the immediate area of our restaurant.

Tony visits Al Covo to sample some of the freshest seafood in all of Venice including some of the house specialties and local favorites: fritto (a large array of small fried fish) and the deep-fried soft-shell crabs caught earlier that day.

Mascaron Resataurant Minchelli CLOSED SUNDAY Calle Lunga, 5225, Castello S.M.Formosa, , 041 5225995 Tony ends his first day in Venice at Gigi's restaurant where the chef has cooked up all the beautiful fish picked out earlier that day during Tony and Gigi's tour of the Rialto fish market.

Trattoria Borghi 1516 S. Basillo, Dorsoduro

After pulling up and docking a mammoth ship, Tony and Stefano meet up with some of Stefano's colleagues at a local trattoria to discuss what makes Venice so unique: the people.

Al Diavolo e L'Acqua Santa Salita, San Polo 561B Calle della Madonna +39 041 2770307 Tony meets up with a local to explore Venice's back alleys full of small eateries where they sample ombretta (a little glass of wine) and bite-size Venetian appetizers.

Cantina Do Mori CLOSED SUNDAY Minchelli San Polo, 429 Calle dei Do Mori

Like everything in Venice, this place is hard to find. It's tucked into an alley way that runs between Ruga Vecchia San Giovanni and Calle Arco. Your best bet is to head south from the Rialto Market and ask someone. Or have your hotel mark it for you on your map. Tony and Gigi start their Bacari (tapas bar) crawl at Cantina Do Mori. They sample some local staples and chat about the Venetian pace of life.

<u>Pronto Pesce</u> **CLOSED SUNDAY & MONDAY** Campo Beccarie 319 San Polo - opposite the Loggia in Rialto fish market, just off Campo delle Beccarie. Tony and Gigi visit the second bacari (tapas bar), which is renowned for putting new, modern, innovative twists on old favorites.

Ruga Rialto Bacari calle del Sturion No. 692, Rialto Andrew eats fresh sardines and cow tendons.

Cantina Da Schiavi **CLOSED SUNDAY** Fondamenta Nani 992 PonteSan Trovaso, Dorsoduro +39 41 523 0034 Cichetti-Andrew eats salt cod with olive oil on a baguette and raw tuna with grated cacao.

THE VENETIAN BACARI TOUR

Take "Vaporetto" boat line 1 from the Santa Maria del Giglio or Accademia stop to San Silvestro. From there, walk along Ruga Rialto, and you will soon reach *Do Mori*, a Traditional bacaro located past a wide arcade or "sotoportego" opening on your left.

Do Mori offers a wide selection of cicheti, including Venetian and Veneto classics and tasty bar-counter snacks prepared just in front of your eyes or coming piping hot straight from the frying pan, to be savoured with a glass of wine. From *Do Mori* continue in the direction of campo San Giacometto, the picturesque setting of **Bancogiro**. This small wine bar – restaurant just 2 minutes away from the Rialto Bridge could not be more down-home Venetian, and yet offer a small but creative range of lunch and dinner dishes.

From San Giacometto, cross the Rialto Bridge and then the square called San Bortolomio. Go through the tunnel-like sotoportego and turn right immediately into a diminutive calle.

At the next corner you will find *Alla Botte*, another favorite spot for *cicheti* that are the trademark food of thisbacaro.

The last stop of this spirituous as well as spiritual tour of the Venetian bacari is **Alla Vedova** on Strada Nuova.

The official name is **Osteria Ca' D' Oro**, but Venetians continue to refer to it as *Alla Vedova*, the widow's place. It is one of the oldest bacari in the city and offers a wide array of tasty dishes, including classics like batter-fried baby artichokes called castraure, fried stuffed olives, baccalà (codfish) with polenta, sliced ham and salami, and tiny octopus (folpetti) in tomatoes sauce or simply boiled and dressed with celery and fresh herbs and other vegetables.

But La *Vedova*'s reputation rests on its polpette, spicy fried meatballs. From here you can walk back to the **Design Hotel Ca' Pisani**, or if you don't trust your legs, take vaporetto n 1 from the Ca' D' Oro stop, direction Lido.
